Bench Limit/Admissions: The roster will be used to check participants' names at the pass gate.

- 14 players, 6 support personnel, 1 medical authority
- Players not in uniform must show photo ID for entry.
- A maximum of two supervisors, with appropriate photo ID, who are listed on the team registration, may enter at the pass gate.

Coaches Meeting: **The coaches meeting will be held on Thursday, November 8, at 7:00pm in the Worthington Center. Teams will meet in Charneski Recreation Center during the coaches meeting.** If the head coach is not able to attend the scheduled meeting, he/she must contact Don Farler, Tournament Manager, to schedule a make-up meeting.

Tournament information, entrance and parking passes will be distributed at the coaches meeting.

Souvenir Merchandise Participants are encouraged to pre-order state event merchandise at www.RushTeamApparel.com beginning Saturday, November 3, at 10am. Garments available for pre-order are sweatshirt, t-shirt, long sleeve t-shirt and sweatpants. The deadline to pre-order will be on Tuesday, November 6, at noon. Merchandise will be available for pick up at the Rush Team Apparel booth, the first morning of your tournament. **Additional items are available on site.** Post event orders will also be available at www.RushTeamApparel.com.

Pass Gate: The pass gate for teams, officials, tournament workers, and supervisors is located at the NE double doors into Pavilion (doors closest to Charneski Rec Center.) **NO ICE CHESTS MAY BE BROUGHT INTO THE FACILITY.** Please use the pass gate when returning to play or watch.

Supervisors: School supervisors must check in at the Pass Gate with photo ID. **The supervisor is responsible for his/her school's conduct.**

Fans: All fans must stay in the designated seating area. Fans are not allowed in or on the court area.

Fan Information: Please advise your fans about the information available in the fan link posted on the WIAA web site at WIAA.com. Doors open for the public one hour before the first match. Information on hotels can be found at: <http://www.visitolympia.com/lodging.php>.

Cheerleaders: Cheerleaders, in uniform and accompanied by their coach, will be admitted at no charge through the pass gate if a cheer roster has been submitted via my.wiaa.com by the school's athletic director.

Concessions: Concessions will be available for the teams and spectators. Food or drink may **NOT** be brought into Saint Martin's Pavilion or the Charneski Rec Center.

Filming: Filming is allowed from the bleachers only provided vision is not blocked for fans. Bring your own accessories.

Game Balls: **Blue/white/gray Spalding** game balls will be provided. Teams must bring their own practice balls.

Handicapped Seating: Handicap seating at court level will be available. Please have your school's supervisor request assistance from the tournament manager or floor manager.

Introductions: All teams will be introduced prior to their **FIRST MATCH.**

Locker Rooms: Limited locker rooms are available for use but are not secure.

Medical Personnel: An athletic trainer from ATI will be on duty throughout the tournament. The trainer will be on duty one hour before play starts each day. **Please supply your own taping materials.**

Noisemakers:	Balloons, silly string and artificial noisemakers will not be allowed and will be confiscated. Schools will be billed for the additional cleanup charges.
Pep Band:	Due to multiple courts in play at the same time, and the potential noise level, pep bands will not be allowed to perform.
Team Parking:	Cars and vans will need a parking pass; a parking pass is not required for school buses. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Passes will be issued at the coaches meeting. • A maximum of 2 passes per team will be provided if traveling by van. • Any additional school district vehicles must pay for parking. • All private vehicles will be charged \$5 for parking.
Passes:	Coaches' passes (WIAA wrist bands) will be in the team packet available at the coaches meeting. <u>WRIST BANDS MUST BE WORN ON THE WRIST and will be used for admission into the facility.</u> Coaches who lose their wrist band must buy a ticket and will lose their court privileges. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medical Staff, who have registered online, will be provided a WIAA wrist band. Medical personnel must have a wrist band to be on the bench. • LOST PASSES WILL NOT BE REPLACED! (Purchase of a ticket will be required) • If the team travels by bus, the team BUS DRIVER must sign in and will be admitted (at no charge) through the pass gate.
Practice:	Coaches are responsible for securing their own practice facilities. PRACTICE WILL NOT BE ALLOWED AT SAINT MARTIN'S PAVILION.
Signs:	Hand held signs, provided they are positive, in support of that team, and do not block the view of any fans, will be allowed. The official school banner may be displayed.
Team Pictures:	Northwest Sports Photography will take team pictures as requested. Teams may schedule appointments for team pictures after the coaches meeting on Thursday evening. Action pictures will be taken throughout tournament and will be for sale on site and online at 4nsp.com.

Tournament:	The 2018-2019 WIAA Bound for State Volleyball Tournament Regulations are attached and will be followed.
Tournament Schedule:	In an attempt to follow the tournament schedule, matches may be shifted from the original court scheduled to the first available court.
Towels:	Towels will not be provided. Teams are responsible for their own towels.
Valuables:	Collect and secure all valuables. Management cannot be responsible for lost or stolen items. Locker rooms are available but not secure.
Warm-ups:	Unofficial warm-ups are available in the Charneski Recreation Center. Official warm-ups will take place in the Pavillion.
Water for teams:	Water coolers will be located in various places around the courts. Teams must bring their own water bottles to refill from those coolers.

Webcast: The championship match will be Webcast live via the NFHS Network for a nominal fee and will be archived on the Network for on-demand viewing 24 hours following the conclusion of the match at no charge.

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Volleyball Draws - The volleyball draws are approved by the WIAA Executive Board and will be posted on the WIAA Web page on the Sunday prior to the state tournament.

Allocations - Allocations in volleyball are made to the WIAA Districts.

Type of Tournament - Each classification will have a sixteen entry tournament modified double elimination tournament with each team guaranteed two (2) matches.

Draw Criteria – Refer to General Tournament Regulations

Team Information and Roster/Bench limit

Schedule, scores, roster and photo must be entered on the school's MaxPreps account.

14 players

All team/school personnel for the pass gate must be entered into the school's MyWIAA account.

6 designated school personnel (coaches, managers, statisticians, etc)

1 medical (must be a licensed health care provider)

2 supervisors

Managers, statisticians, support personnel must be bona fide 7th through 12th grade students of the school district or school-district approved adults.

Pass gate personnel are restricted to only those individuals and/or teams who have qualified for that event.

WIAA HANDBOOK RULE 25.3.0 SUBSTITUTION OF PLAYERS IN POSTSEASON QUALIFYING AND STATE TOURNAMENTS - When a team qualifies for postseason competition, the school shall submit the roster to the appropriate tournament manager. Changes in the roster are permitted from one (1) level of competition to the next level except in baseball, basketball, football and soccer where changes are allowed between each round of play **except at the final site.**

LEVEL - A league tournament would be considered the first level; a district tournament would be considered the next level; a combined district/regional tournament would be considered the next level; and the state tournament would be considered the final level. No changes are permitted at that level once the tournament begins.

ROSTER CHANGES ALLOWED IN VOLLEYBALL >

League > District > STATE

WIAA HANDBOOK RULE 22.3.1 In the event of an emergency, unforeseen circumstances, or catastrophe after the tournament begins and a substantial number of team members are unable to participate, team members may be replaced if approved by the WIAA Executive Director or designee, thereby permitting a school to add eligible players to restore the team to the original number for tournament play.

Pre-Tournament Practice - There will be no practice at the site during the two days prior to the tournament. State Tournament Managers may compile a list of available schools within a reasonable distance of the state tournament site as potential practice sites. Qualified teams will work through the tournament manager to secure a practice or meeting place.

Protest Procedures and Games Committee – Refer to the General Tournament Regulations

Officials - Two (2) WOA certified WIAA officials will be assigned to each match. Scorekeepers, two (2) lines judges and libero trackers/clock operators will be assigned to each match by the head official. Four (4) lines judges may be assigned to the consolation and championship matches.

Ground Rules - Ground rules will be explained at each site by the Tournament Manager or head official.

Match Schedule - It is the coach's responsibility to see that the team is near the assigned playing court at least 25 minutes prior to match time.

Game Balls - Each school must provide warm-up balls. Blue/gray/white Spalding VB5 game balls will be provided. The officials will select the game ball from those provided.

Warm-up Time – Official warm-ups may be scheduled on a different court, with only the final 2 minutes on the assigned competition court.

Warm-up time for the first round on the first day of the tournament for each classification will be 20 minutes, with 6 minutes for the home team, followed by 6 minutes for the visiting team, followed by 4 minutes for the home team, followed by 4 minutes for the visiting team (home team is the bottom team on the bracket). Warm-up time for all subsequent rounds will be **14 minutes; with 5 minutes for the home team, followed by 5 minutes for the visiting team, followed by 2 minutes for the home team, followed by 2 minutes for the visiting team.**

Teams are not allowed to warm-up on the sidelines or endlines while waiting for their court time.

Awards - Trophies will be presented for 1st through 8th places. The awards ceremonies will take place immediately following each match in which trophies are presented.

EXCERPT FROM THE 2018-19 BOUND FOR STATE GENERAL TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

- L. Games Committees** -Each Event Manager shall appoint and name a Games Committee for all postseason contests. The Games Committee will be on site or readily accessible by phone for all postseason qualifying and/or state contests. Participating coaches will be informed of the process and makeup of the Games Committee prior to each postseason event.

Duties of the Games Committee shall be as follows:

1. Assist the tournament director as needed and be immediately available to him/her at all times during the event.
2. Act as an arbitration board of dispute on questions or protests that might arise. The final decision will be the consensus of the Games Committee.
3. Questions concerning infractions may be brought to the Games Committee by the head coach or school administrator responsible for the team, not by a contestant, parent or spectator.
4. The Games Committee shall be composed of no fewer than three, nor more than five, members. Games committee members will include 1) the contest manager or designee; 2) the head official; 3) a coach, athletic director or school administrator; and may include 4) the official scorekeeper or 5) another event staff member. The Games Committee members may not have a conflict of interest with the teams/individuals involved with the game under dispute.

- M. Protests** - In all WIAA-approved state tournaments, protests must meet the following requirements in order to be heard:

1. Protests of an official's judgment will not be heard. When a head coach feels that there has been a misinterpretation or misapplication of a specific playing rule, the coach shall notify the game officials following the incident in question and prior to the resumption of action that the contest is under protest.
2. At that point the official(s) will suspend the contest until a decision of the Games Committee has been determined.
3. The Games Committee will meet immediately or as soon as is reasonably possible upon receiving notification of the protest. During the meeting of the Games Committee, the coach shall be afforded the opportunity to present rationale and justification including the specific rule(s) in question, how the tournament officials misapplied or misinterpreted the rule(s), and the desired outcome of the protest. The official(s) shall be afforded the opportunity to present the rule and its implementation in the protested situation.
4. The Games Committee will consult with the WIAA staff member who oversees that sport; will follow any additional protest procedures covered in the specific NFHS rule book; and will utilize the NFHS and/or WIAA playing rules, scorebook, and/or statistics to determine the appropriate ruling.
5. The Games Committee will deliberate in closed session.
6. The decision of the Games Committee is final.

PROTEST PROCEDURES - HEAD COACH'S ROLE

1. Notify the game official(s) following the incident in question and prior to the resumption of action that the contest is being protested. The contest will be suspended at that point.
2. Notify the contest manager of the specific NFHS and/or WIAA rule that was misinterpreted or misapplied.
3. Present rationale and justification regarding the misinterpreted or misapplied rule during the Games Committee meeting.
4. Acknowledge that the decision of the Games Committee is final.

PROTEST PROCEDURES - OFFICIAL'S ROLE

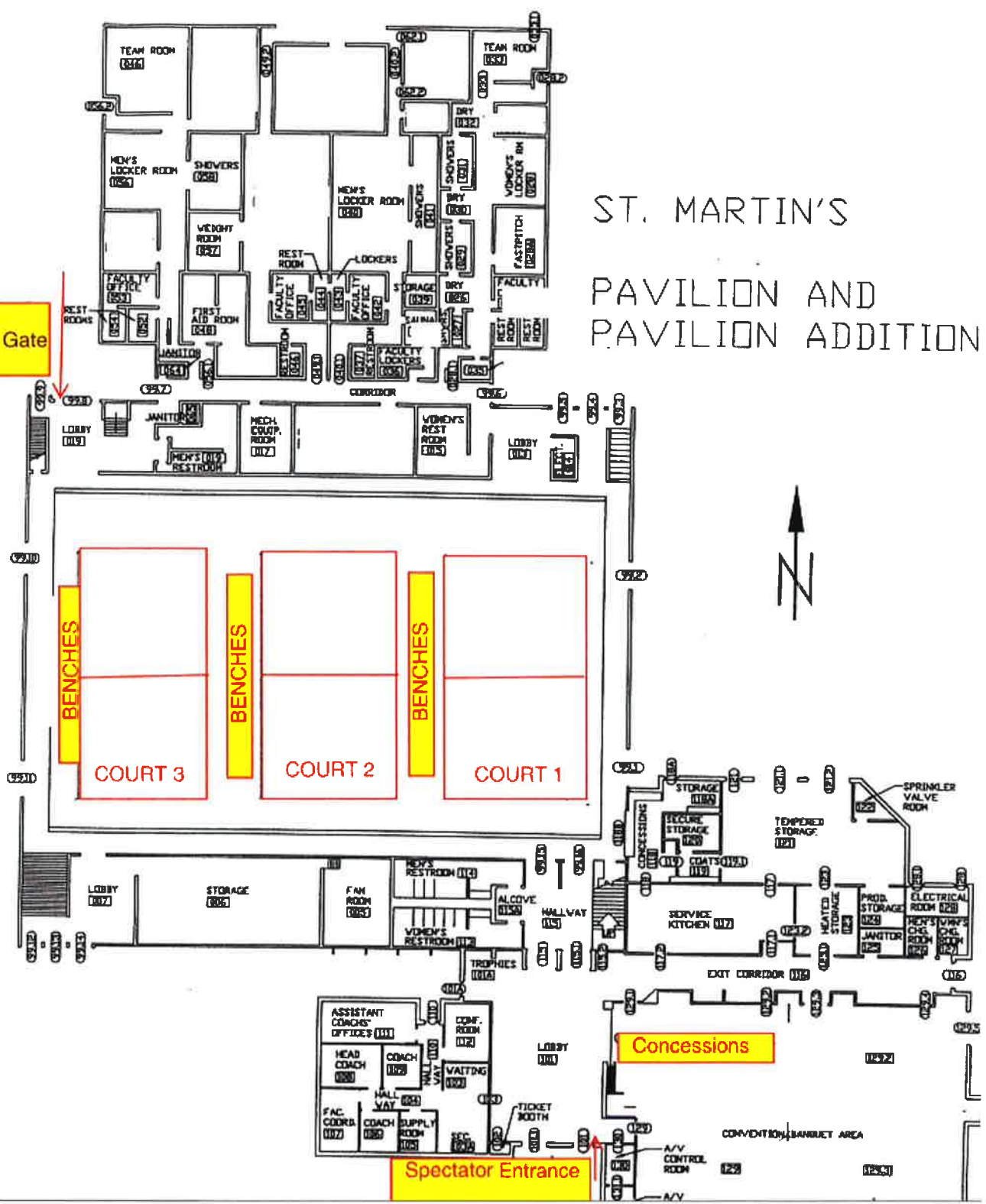
1. Note in the official scorebook that a protest has been filed and any other specific information that will be necessary if/when the contest is resumed (players on the court/field; number of fouls on individuals as well as the team; number of outs in the inning; next batter/server; score; etc).
2. Suspend the contest until a decision of the Games Committee is reached.
3. Present rationale and justification regarding the situation during the Games Committee meeting.
4. Acknowledge that the decision of the Games Committee is final.
5. Resume the contest.

PROTEST PROCEDURES - CONTEST MANAGER'S ROLE

1. Form a Games Committee before the event begins. Have alternate Committee members lined up in the event one (or more) potential members has a conflict of interest with the teams/individuals involved in the protest. WIAA Executive Board members, WIAA staff members and District Directors may provide guidance or assistance regarding the process, but cannot be involved in the decision.
2. Collect from the coach the NFHS and/or WIAA rule that was misinterpreted or misapplied.
3. Immediately convene the Games Committee.
4. Provide the coach and the officials with the opportunity to present the situation and ruling to the Games Committee.
5. Insure deliberations of the Games Committee are in closed session.
6. Relay the decision of the Games Committee to the head coaches of both teams involved.
7. Resume the contest.

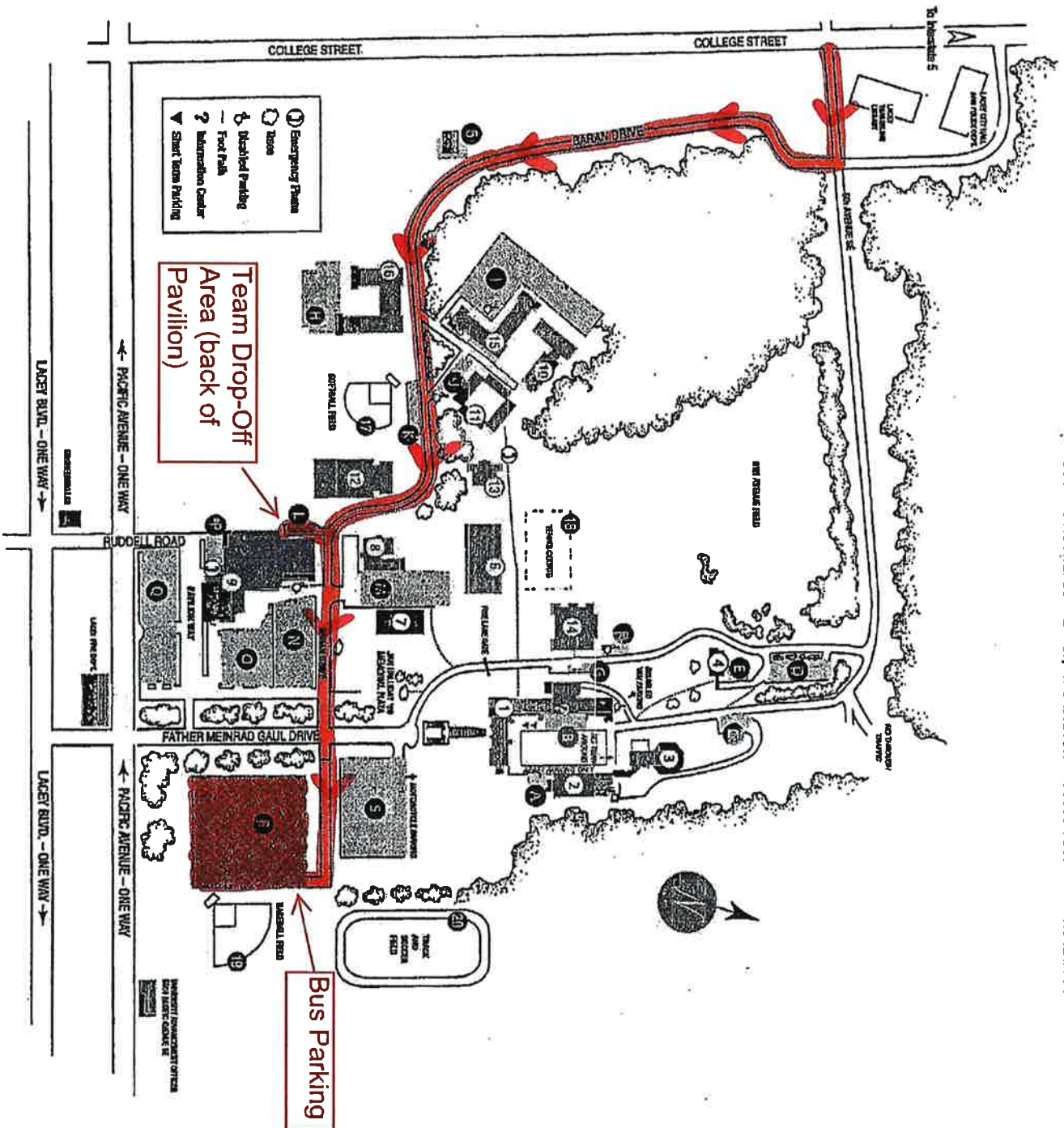
ST. MARTIN'S PAVILION AND PAVILION ADDITION

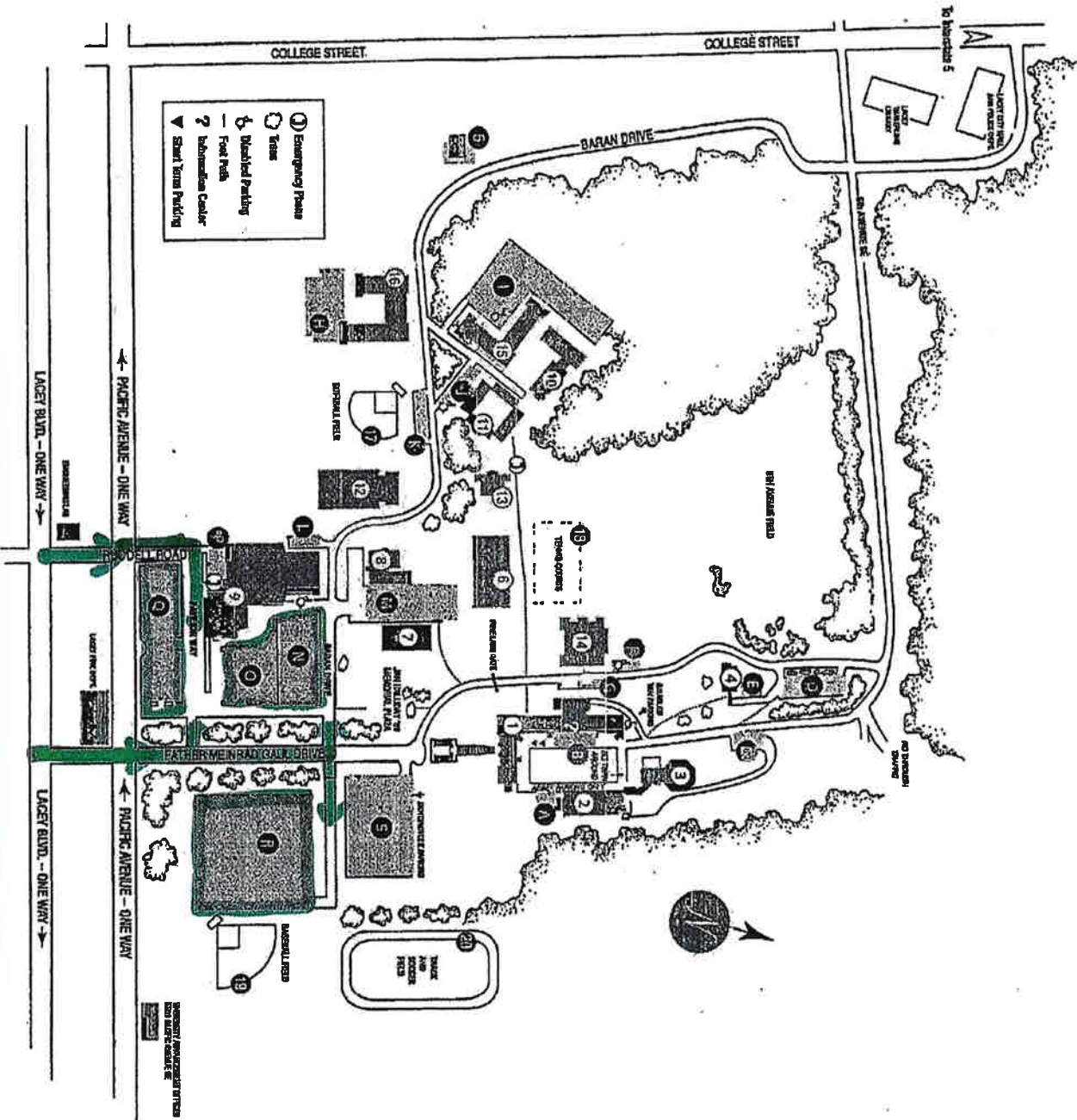
